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Funding Shortfall Threatens Eau Claire Sojourner House Operations – Community Leaders Rally to Protect Critical Service

Eau Claire, WI – For more than a decade, Eau Claire’s [Sojourner House](#) has been a lifeline for those experiencing homelessness in the community, providing safety, stability and compassion to those with nowhere else to turn.

Now, due to declining funding and a shortage of volunteers, [Catholic Charities of the Diocese of La Crosse](#) is faced with the difficult decision of potentially reducing Sojourner House’s operations from year-round to just six months per year. This change would leave many in Eau Claire without a safe place to turn during the heat of summer.

“Sojourner House is more than just a shelter—it is a place of refuge, dignity and hope,” said a representative from Catholic Charities.

Recognizing the Sojourner House’s vital role in the community and the urgent need to sustain year-round operations, local leaders, including representatives from the City and County of Eau Claire, the [Diocese of La Crosse](#) and the Eau Claire Chamber of Commerce, have begun discussions to explore solutions that would guarantee year-round support for those experiencing homelessness.
