CV Airport deliberating on two airline proposals

Current federal EAS contract for Sun Country flights up for renewal

At its meeting last Wednesday, the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport Commission heard details of the two proposals it has received for providing passenger air service under the federal Essential Air Service (EAS) program.

The EAS contract is currently held by Sun Country Airlines, who took over the contract in December 2022 after the previous carrier, SkyWest (operating as United Express), announced it was pulling out of 29 EAS markets because of the pilot shortage. The two-year contract ends later this year, so the USDOT opened the opportunity for proposals for the service.

The EAS program was created under airline deregulation to provide federal subsidies, with some cost limits, to guarantee passenger air service to communities who would otherwise lose it.

At the June 26 Commission meeting, Mike Mooney from Volaire Aviation, the airport's consultant, outlined and compared the proposals received by Sun Country, who wants to continuing serving the airport into 2028, and SkyWest, who wants to come back and has proposed a 3-year contract.

Sun Country provides several weekly flights to Minneapolis-St. Paul, and seasonal direct flights to Ft. Myers, Orlando, and Las Vegas, all using Boeing 737 jet aircraft. The proposal from SkyWest is for 12 round trips per week between Eau Claire and United's hub at Chicago O'Hare, utilizing 50 passenger regional jets. Under Sun Country's current contract, the airport has fewer weekly departures, but its ridership surpassed 50,000 passengers in 2023 for the first time since 2004. SkyWest said the pilot shortage has run its course and availability of pilots for its flights has stabilized.

Comparing each airline's first-year forecast, Sun Country estimates a total of 50,027 passengers on 512 total flights, with a subsidy per passenger of \$135 and a total subsidy of \$6.7 million. SkyWest estimates a total of 34,944 passengers on 1,211 flights, with a subsidy per passenger of \$169 and a total subsidy of \$5.9 million.

According to the consultant, the bottom line is that the Commission has two good proposals from strong airlines, but can select only one under the federal subsidy program. Although the decision on which carrier will be made by US DOT, the consultant said the airport's recommendation is likely to be accepted. The airport's deadline is July 23 to provide a letter to US DOT.

The Commission met in closed session after Wednesday's presentation and accepted the recommendation of the consultant to interview each airline as the next step. There may also be private negotiations with each carrier as the Commission moves towards a recommendation.

During the public comment portion of last week's meeting, a few individuals favoring each carrier made comments about their preferences. The Chamber's Vice President Governmental Affairs, Scott Rogers, thanked the Commission and Airport Director Charity Zich for its work two years ago to maintain commercial service, and expressed confidence that they would carefully consider the best interests of the airport and the wider community.

Top 3 state Civics Bee finalists from the Chippewa Valley Rya Mousavi from DeLong wins first place

Rya Mousavi, a student at Eau Claire's DeLong Middle School, has been named the first-ever Wisconsin Civics Bee champion. Rya competed against seven other finalists from around the state in Madison on June 14, answering Civics trivia questions and presenting portions of her submitted essay.

The competition, the first-of-its kind in Wisconsin, was organized by the WMC Foundation in partnership with the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation. It is modeled on traditional spelling and geography bees, encouraging students to share ideas for improving their communities and show their enthusiasm for civics.

Earlier in the year, students in 6th, 7th, and 8th grades were invited to compete in regional bees, hosted by the Fox Cities Chamber of Commerce, the Racine Area Manufacturers & Commerce, and the Wausau Chamber of Commerce. Winners of the regional bees participated in the state finals. The Eau Claire Chamber invited students in our region to compete in the Wausau competition.

2nd and 3rd place finishers also from area

Rya won a \$1,000 cash prize for the victory, and will represent Wisconsin in the inaugural National Civics Bee national championship in Washington, D.C., in the fall for a chance to win prizes worth more than \$50,000. Megan Christensen from Colfax Middle School and Elissa Karls from DeLong Middle School placed second and third, respectively, and earned cash prizes as well.

"Congratulations to Rya and all of the other finalists for making Wisconsin history," said WMC President & CEO Kurt R. Bauer. "We're thrilled to partner with other chambers to build enthusiasm for civic engagement and United States history through this competition."
