The methodology

- The survey was conducted Oct. 26-Nov. 2, 2023, interviewing 908 Wisconsin registered voters, with a margin of error of +/-4.5 percentage points.
- The sample includes 402 Republicans and independents who lean Republican, with a margin of error of +/-6.8 percentage points.





Partisan makeup

- The partisan makeup of the sample is 30% Republican, 29% Democratic and 41% independent.
- Since January 2020, the long-term partisan balance has been 30% Republican and 28% Democratic, with 41% independent.





The methodology, what's new!

- We've changed how we conduct the poll
- The survey was conducted with a hybrid sample of 690 respondents selected from the Wisconsin voter registration list, and 218 selected from the SSRS Opinion Panel, a sample drawn from postal addresses across the state and invited to take part in surveys online.
- The interviews were conducted online with 693 respondents and with 215 by telephone with live interviewers.





The methodology, what's new!

- Respondents find answering the poll online is easy—on smartphone, tablet or laptop
- And doing it when convenient rather than when we call
- We send an email invitation to those registered voters for whom we have an email address, also text with a web link, and do both email and call followup for those who don't respond promptly as well as call those with no email.








Biden vs. Trump: The fine print

- Biden 44, Haley 53






